Given a passage at instructional level, STUDENT will read a 100 word passage in less than 2 minutes making no more than 12 oral reading errors for 5 consecutive sessions Given the basic sight words, STUDENT will read 100 sight words with 100% accuracy on 5 consecutive trials Given a list of vocabulary words, STUDENT will read the words correctly with 90%

Dolch Sight Word Assessment

Dolch Sight Word Assessment Directions Give each child a copy of the Dolch Sight Word List for the level you are assessing Highlight the words correct or circle the words that are incorrect Calculate the number of words correct and percentage correct This will make it easy to track progress using a simple progress monitoring graph

Miscue Analysis for Classroom Use

Usually considered only as a part of informal reading inventory as a package, miscue analysis is overlooked as a helpful tool in and of itself Abbreviated forms can be conducted on the spot with nothing more than a pencil and a duplicate of the student's text One might even
